





Browse through an ever-growing collection of digitized imagery and historical

information through Michiganology, and search several genealogical resources through FamilySearch. Interested in maps? Take a peek at online sources from Muskegon County GIS, which provides interactive location-based information. Not to mention, you can take a look at available Sanborn Fire Insurance maps of Muskegon County, as well as hundreds more from Michigan and the United States, made possible through The Library of Congress. Muskegon County Cemetery Viewer is another helpful resource to utilize for genealogy tasks.



Don't forget, you can also access news resources, such as archives of the Muskegon Chronicle, America's News, the Grand Rapids Press Collection, and

nore!



There are so many intriguing resources waiting for you to discover. Go to hackleylibrary.org, and at the top of the page click the "Local History & Genealogy" tab. From there you'll find access to online resources right at your fingertips.






